Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program Office of the State Treasurer

Your Gov. Guinn Millennium Scholarship award is paid each semester you are enrolled in classes according to provisions established by the Nevada Revised Statutes.

- ✓ **\$40 per credit** in lower division and **\$60 per credit** in each upper division course for students attending an NSHE community college
- ✓ **\$60 per credit** for students attending an NSHE state college
- ✓ **\$80 per credit** for students attending an NSHE university or other eligible institutions¹

If you are receiving other financial aid to cover your education expenses, the Gov. Guinn Millennium Scholarship award must be used only for:

- ✓ Registration fees, laboratory fees, and expenses;
- ✓ Purchase of required textbooks and course materials; and
- ✓ Other costs related to the attendance of the student at the eligible institution.²

If you have surplus funds remaining because of other financial aid, a residual check may be provided to you for the remaining semester value of your Gov. Guinn Millennium Scholarship award. Please check the procedures of the financial aid office at the institution you attend.

DID YOU KNOW? You may still apply for federal financial aid, even if receiving the Gov. Guinn Millennium Scholarship. We encourage all students to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You will need your most recently completed income tax forms and your parents' income tax forms. For more information, go to www.fafsa.gov. The application takes less than an hour to complete and will enable you to apply for not only federal financial aid, but state and institutional grants and work study.
